# Promoting Mission in our Community

Our dedicated and passionate people enthusiastically and consistently bring our mission to life through serving the community – locally, nationally and overseas.

### Christianity in Action through our volunteers

The San is blessed to have more than 280 dedicated Volunteers who generously gave almost 30,000 hours of their time to help our patients, staff and their community.

Our San Volunteers can be seen assisting nursing staff on the wards with non-clinical activities, including time spent talking to patients and keeping them company when required. They may be serving in our San Gifts shop, greeting and assisting hospital patients and visitors on arrival and as they leave, and helping patients and community members who use the facilities of Jacaranda Lodge and the Cancer Support Centre. They provide Spiritual Care support as Volunteer Chaplains, and support office staff in various hospital departments, including making up Emergency Care Packs funded by San Foundation.

Our highly valued volunteer team are also engaged with knitting blankets, beanies, baby booties, teddy bears, and sewing activity blankets for both ICU and Burnside Ward, in support of the hospital that they love. The hospital benefits enormously from the dedication and commitment of San Volunteers and we hope to see this wonderful service continue to grow in the coming years.



### San Gifts

The power of gifts, donations, volunteering and teamwork continue to be celebrated in our San Gifts shop. Run by our San Volunteers, the shop provides staff, patients and visitors with a range of thoughtfully chosen, beautiful gifts with a unique double benefit – finding the perfect gift for someone special while helping raise money for life-saving equipment and supporting the San. This year saw the launch of our new online store, enabling family members and loved ones to send thoughtful gifts to patients from anywhere in Australia or overseas.

through community fundraising

San Foundation actively works with grateful hospital patients, local community groups and businesses to raise much needed funds for Sydney Adventist Hospital; funds that have been crucial this year in helping the hospital maintain its reputation for excellence and fulfilling its Mission of caring for the community. During this year funding has enabled the purchase of new life-saving cardiac and diagnostic equipment, upgrade operating theatres, improve facilities and services for patients undergoing regular cancer treatment, purchase equipment to help care for newborns needing extra attention, and train our staff to provide specialist care.

San Foundation also provides Emergency Care Packs for patients unexpectantly admitted, as well as moral lifting initiatives for hospital staff.

In 2023/24 the generous support of San Foundation donors meant that more than \$2.65M was provided to Sydney Adventist Hospital.

### Christianity in Action through education

AHCL provides ongoing health education to our community through a number of initiatives including:

- Education facilities on site at the San for medical and allied health students in partnership between Adventist HealthCare and The Australian National University; for nursing students in partnership with Avondale University; and for staff and our community through San Education - teaching healing to future health carers by providing formal education courses for medical, nursing and allied health professionals at AHCL and in the community. Courses for the healthcare workforce this year included advanced life support and ECG training, plus workshops and conferences focused on obstetric emergencies, stroke, wound, deteriorating patients and palliative care
- Delivery of formal and accredited Clinical Pastoral Education – there is strong interest in this program, with 36 students this year and places already filled for 2024-25. Previous graduates are all currently involved in chaplaincy and pastoral ministry within the South Pacific Division

- Online health education sessions are provided free to the community, with webinars providing access for a wider audience
- Formal accredited medical education is provided free to General Practitioners (GPs) in the community. We are continuing with our hybrid of online webinars and face-toface conferences this year, both of which are popular and well attended by our GP community
- AHCL cardiac specialists recognised globally as leaders in their field facilitated training for visiting cardiologists as part of the San Structural Heart Centre of Excellence for Left Atrial Appendage program
- AHCL staff and doctors continue to share health information on our regular 2GB Radio Program
- Birthing and parenting education programs are provided to improve the life skills of new mums and their families. These continue to be offered online through Cradle, the San's education portal, as live zoom classes and as face-to-face sessions, providing a variety of options for our patients

### through wellness and support services

Free information, resources, support groups and assistance are provided to patients and their carers within the community. The cancer support service is sustained by a large team of volunteers from our community. Jacaranda Lodge provides low-cost accommodation onsite at SAH for patients and their carers.

Focus on wellness services is a key aspect of our provision of Whole Person Health, with a range of wellness services aimed at helping people stay healthy provided across our key service areas – such as cardiac rehabilitation, pre and post-natal exercise, and post-cancer cancer surgery exercise. Additional services are offered on-site through our affiliation with ELIA Wellness and the Lifestyle Medicine Centre.

Our Cancer Support Centre continued to see growth in participation in their quality services this year. The counselling service grew by more than 20%, while new support groups and therapy programs plus onsite forums expanded our existing offerings and meant we could offer support for oncology patients and their families on 3,800 occasions.

### through community events and activities

Several regular community events are conducted each year to support our community and promote whole person health and wellbeing:

- Annual Memorial Service this ecumenical service of Remembrance and Thanksgiving brings community members together to support families that have lost loved ones and remember those who received care and support at the San. This returned to being an onsite event in 2023
- San Carols by Candlelight we welcomed our community back to the Village Green again for our annual San Carols program with wonderful perfomances and a fantastic fireworks display
- **Teddy Bears Picnic** this much-loved event brought hundreds of mums with their bubs and families back to the San again, to the great delight of our community and all the staff and doctors involved
- Annual San Homecoming event current and former staff, nursing graduates, doctors, volunteers, friends, and family shared in a special 120-year celebration of the hospital that recognised our history, our commitment to Mission and to advancing whole-person health and wellbeing for the communities that we serve. The day included Sabbath School and Worship programs, lunch and afternoon tea, a tour of the Merritt Kellogg Museum, and a closing Sabbath service

### through outreach

Outreach activities provide excellent opportunities for our staff and doctors to extend our Mission to the community:

- SAH provides work opportunities for disabled individuals – helping them transition into community work through gaining job ready skills and employment in areas such as the Mail Room, Food Services, Theatres, Human Resources and Grounds
- AHCL continues to support Open Heart International (humanitarian aid program initiated by the San, now partnering with ADRA). This amazing program continues to transform lives in overseas countries, with international trips increasing to include more countries this year
- San Prayer Hotline 24x7 launched during the Week of Prayer
- **Compassionate Care Calls** regularly made to previous patients. This initiative commenced during COVID to contact people in the community who were lonely and needing support, care and compassion.

Since October 2019, more than 33,000 phone calls have been made by our Spiritual Care Volunteers





**Staff are actively involved in local outreach services** such as 'The Dish' in Hornsby, where staff regularly attend on Friday nights to serve meals and provide support to the local homeless and disadvantaged. Staff also support fundraising projects and activities for the community such as the Breast Cancer Network Australia, R U OK? Day, Lifeline, Prostate Cancer Foundation Australia and the Cancer Council

### **Mission Beyond Borders**

A team of six, including the Director of Mission and two chaplains, represented AHCL as part of the large evangelistic 'PNG for Christ' series in Papua New Guinea. Director of Mission Steve Stephenson and Chaplain Yvonne Hypolite both preached over 16 nights at different locations, while Chaplain Kym Cross and others in the team gave health and wellbeing talks, conducted workshops and shared in worship through song. The trip also encompassed visits to schools and training centres, hospitals and clinics, churches, villages, an orphanage and Pacific Adventist University.

The experience was rich and rewarding, and the team were moved by the overwhelming generosity of the people, the hard work of the local church community, the resilience and faith of the people which resulted in more than 3,200 baptisms during the series.

# Mission and Culture Initiatives

- Mission Ambassador Program providing inspiration, encouragement, and a structure for peer-initiated mission enculturation across the organisation, with recognition of staff who exemplify Mission including awards at the annual AHCL Thrive Awards evening and via staff communications
- Annual Staff (Thrive) Week with Mission related activities and other staff celebrations
- Annual Leadership Focus Day with Mission related presentations and activities to inspire our leaders with new ways of integrating Mission into their areas
- Monday Mission Message distributed to leadership and staff – focusing on specific aspects of the organisation's Mission and Values, including a simple prayer that can be used in meetings

## 24 Hour Prayer, Praise and Fasting Event

The community united in gratitude and faith during a 24-hour prayer and fasting event, the first of this nature to be held at the San. The uplifting and unifying event featured more than 20 speakers from around the world, from local church pastors to global Church leaders from the South Pacific Division and the General Conference. Throughout the 24 hours there were songs of praise and worship, testimony and prayer, with people encouraged to fast if they wished.

As an unambiguously faith-based health care provider who is welcoming of people of all races and all beliefs, the purpose of this event at the San was to acknowledge our God for his countless blessings over 120 years and give thanks in anticipation for his continued blessing.

# Direct-contact mission with the goal of creating new worshipping groups

Bringing Jesus to patients and their families through care beyond the patient room; follow-up care post death and trauma; 'engage and empower' programs for patients and families connecting them to the Adventist church. This is a three-year plan for intentional engagement with nearly 2,500 patient families and 1,000 staff and doctor families each year through compassionate care programs.

# Developing creative mission initiatives & contextualized materials

Continual ongoing engagement with AHCL staff & doctors to deepen their understanding of the healing ministry of Jesus and how they can share in this ministry as they care for their patients.

### Strengthen the organisational culture

Build a culture grounded in our Christian and organisational values where we respect and encourage others to experience hope and wholeness of life. A video on AHCL Mission is provided to all employees, providing education on mission, historical background, our Adventist identity and caring for our community. Each person appointed to a leadership role meets with the Director of Mission Integration, and awareness sessions are run for nursing staff, particularly those identified as potential leaders.

### **Mission Induction Program for doctors**

Share an orientation pack with all new accredited doctors plus a care pack for the 1,300 currently accredited doctors.

### Spiritual Fest 2025 - 2028

In December of each year we will be hosting a Spiritual Fest in Wahroonga Adventist Church, where we will reap the harvest for the seeds sown during that year.

### Missional impact to neighbouring countries

Intentionally engage in mission partnership with other countries in conducting health camps, evangelistic campaigns, week of prayers, camp meetings, discipleship and Church planting.

## Religious Liberty and Human Rights initiatives

Biennial conference & programs on Human Rights and Religious Liberty for the San community including doctors, staff, patients and their families.
